

Did you know that we have the brewers of Brown Van Beer living at Hudson Park?

Erica and Paul Braunovan were the very first people to move into 235 Kent Street, and this spring they launched their very first beer – a Kolsch!

With daughters Ashena (9) and Shania (6), they love living in downtown Ottawa and they are really excited about brewing beer that people in Ottawa are raving about. Both attended Carleton U and then travelled together to explore their roots in Ireland (where they became engaged) and Germany. With a shared passion for beer, they sampled and compared countless types and brands in both those countries.

In August, Erica sat down with Jan Morgan, a member of the Communications Committee, so that we could learn a little more about our neighbours – the conversation is edited for print.





Why are you brewing Kolsch? - and what is it? Kolsch beer originated in Cologne, and our Brown Van Kolsch would even pass the purity test in Germany! It's a beer that we both really like and it's a beer that really stands out. The fermentation stage gives it the full and fruity taste of good ale, plus it's 'lagered' at cold temperatures which makes it nicely crisp and clean. It's a great drink to start out with and pairs very well with food. In summer, Kolsch is pleasantly refreshing and in fact, it stands up as a substantial beer all year round.

We are told that people who try our Kolsch tend to order a second one – it's really easy to drink! And it's going to be a brilliant part of Oktoberfest given its German origins! ...Last week we were eating out and we couldn't believe it because some people walked in and we actually over heard them say "YAY! Brown Van is still on tap"!

What's next? Paul has worked through the arduous red tape for LCBO approval- so fingers crossed there... and we will introduce our beer to more pubs and restaurants. Then it's back to recipes and tasting for an Irish ale to honour Paul's roots!

It's a good time to remind ourselves to visit some important housekeeping items.

Heat Pumps

Maintenance of the heat pumps located in each unit is the owners' responsibility. Please be diligent in replacing the filters and having the unit inspected and cleaned by a professional on a regular basis to prevent water leakage, ensure cleaner air delivery to your unit, and keep the system running optimally. Walmar and Filtration Lab are two companies that carry the correct-sized filters for the our heat pumps. While you may choose any HVAC company, Vision Air has an existing relationship with HP and is familiar with our systems.

Dryer Filters

Maintenance of the clothes dryer lint filters is two-fold

- 1) Clean out the lint trap **inside** your dryer before each use.
- 2) A secondary filter which vents to the **outside** is mounted on the wall or in the ceiling where your dryer is housed (see picture below). This needs to be cleaned regularly to prevent blockages and possible fires.

There is good news to report about the Bike Room at Hudson Park (on Level A of the garage). As most of you know, in late August the Condo Board instituted a registration system, whereby stickers had to be claimed and affixed to bicycles by those using the room. This was done because the facility had become quite overcrowded, and it was thought that this might be because some residents had moved out without taking their bikes. While that turned out to be true, the number of unclaimed bikes was not as large as anticipated. In fact there were only three, which have been duly removed and donated to charity as promised.

We can say that the Law of Unintended Consequences came into play here to everyone's benefit. In this clean-up process a few more than the three abandoned bikes were also taken out of the room. Moreover, not only did owners affix stickers to their bikes as required, but they also stood them back up and parked them in the racks wherever possible. The room is now far less a jumble than it once was!

At last count there were 36 bicycles parked in the room. Sadly, 14 of them had flat tires and are therefore merely taking up space that could be used by residents with working bikes. Regardless (and to end on a positive note), the situation in the Bike Room is much improved, and everyone at Hudson Park involved in the effort is to be applauded.
